A Single Voice for Many: Walt Whitman's "Song of Myself" and Maya Angelou's "On the Pulse of Morning"

- (1) When Maya Angelou read the poem she had written specifically for President Bill Clinton's 1993 inauguration ceremony, many people were reminded of Robert Frost's on-the-spot recitation of "The Gift Outright" at President Kennedy's 1961 inauguration. (2) Frost's reading of this memorable poem was impressive and continues to resonate even today. (3) But it was another famous white-haired poet whose voice seemed to echo as if he were standing on stage with Angelou and Clinton. (4) That poet is Walt Whitman.
- (5) Whitman and Angelou wrote about 100 years apart. (6) Angelou's "On the Pulse of Morning" and Whitman's "Song of Myself" both fundamentally call forth the ageless ideal of creating and speaking your own powerful voice. (7) For both poets, this means finding your own voice despite any challenges you may face.
- (8) Both poets identify slavery both historical and literal as a weighty challenge to those seeking their own voice. (9) In stanza 11, for example, Angelou writes,

Lift up your hearts
Each new hour holds new chances
For a new beginning.
Do not be wedded forever
To fear, yoked eternally
To brutishness.

- (10) She encourages all people to start breaking restrictive chains, taking new steps forward, and how to carve out individual voices. (11) She wants people to find a voice that will answer their "true yearning to respond to / The singing River and the wise Rock." (12) Alluding to Langston Hughes' poem "The Negro Speaks of Rivers," Angelou evokes a symbolic river that represents the universal soul of the African American experience. (13) She implies that this river continues to flow for all oppressed people, saying, "The River sang and sings on."
- (14) A single voice can transcend its speaker. (15) Whitman maps out this all-encompassing voice in "Song of Myself" when he famously opens the first version of the extended poem,

I celebrate myself,

And what I assume you shall assume,

For every atom belonging to me as good belongs to you.

- (16) Whitman's gist is that anyone can claim this celebratory voice. (17) Everyone has the right to share his or her own song. (18) They do this with lists. (19) Whitman's list includes "the wicked just the same as the righteous . . . / [not] a single person slighted or left away." (20) For Angelou, this list includes "You, the Turk, the Arab, the Swede, the German, the Eskimo, the Scot, / You the Ashanti, the Yoruba, the Kru." (21) Angelou and Whitman suggest that, although they happen to be the ones on the proverbial stage at the moment, no one's voice is any less worthy than theirs.
- (22) "Song of Myself" and "On the Pulse of Morning" both succeed in sparking that voice in one and in many. (23) Call it a cry in the wilderness. (24) Call it a shout from the rooftops. (25) Call it a painful howl. (26) It is a resounding song in the shower. (27) Whatever name you give this voice from within, it must be heard. (28) Whitman's goal is summed up at the end of the extended poem: "I sound my barbaric yawp over the roofs of the world." (29) Angelou's goal may be quieter, but it is just as powerful:

And say simply Very simply With hope— Good morning.

(30) Although they are from different generations and backgrounds, Walt Whitman and Maya Angelou continue to inspire people. (31) They do so with their poetic reminders that we all have a voice worth discovering and, more important, being heard.

Calling All Firefighters

- (1) VOLUNTEERS URGENTLY NEEDED. (2) You may have seen lawn signs like this around town for the last week or two. (3) Bradley Beach United Engine & Truck is seeking volunteers. (4) Joining the fire department requires a big commitment, no doubt about it. (5) Our volunteer firefighters pursue a lot of training and certifications that enable them to fight fires and respond to other emergencies capably, confidently, and in keeping with insurance and other requirements.

Explanations

1. The correct answer for the first drop-down menu is "dwelled in" because it most clearly conveys the author's point that the family does not take up permanent residence in any one place. The correct answer for the second drop-down menu is "glanced" because this word most accurately describes the character's actions. She quickly looks behind her because she is being followed by an unknown pursuer. The most precise phrase in the third drop-down menu is "Striding boldly through." This phrasing best reinforces the author's statements that the "fierce creature" is "very large, noisy, and fast" as it pursues the woman.

- 2. This is the only answer choice that both eliminates the repetition of "her missions in space," and maintains the main idea of both original sentences. The other sentences either just combine the two originals or leave something out.
- 3. In the second paragraph, sentence 6 mentions the legend of the Trojan horse. The third paragraph describes in detail how the wooden horse was used as a means to enter the city and conquer it. Thus, sentence 6 could be used to end the third paragraph, as the paragraph mentions how the legend of the Trojan horse was formed.
- 4. Revising is the process of rewriting or reworking a piece of writing for clarity, style, unity, and organization.

 The sentence "For both poets, this means finding your own voice despite any challenges you may face" needs to be revised for clarity. The writer uses the word "this" in the sentence, which is a demonstrative adjective. When using a demonstrative adjective, modify it with the appropriate noun to ensure understanding. One way to revise the sentence would be the following: Both poets define this aspiration as finding your own voice despite any challenges you may face.
- 5. The best transition to add here would be one that shows contrast to the previous paragraph about people of other cultures' celebration of St. Paddy's Day. "However," "But," or "On the contrary," would all be good transitions to use here.
- 6. The correct answer for the first drop-down menu is "distinctive" because this word most clearly conveys the author's point that unique patterns of color help distinguish coral snakes from other species of snakes. The most precise phrase in the second drop-down menu is "On other continents." The other answer choices use vague words such as "areas" and "regions" that are not as specific as "continents." The correct answer for the third drop-down menu is "disturb" because this wording best reinforces the author's point that wild animals can be dangerous when humans interact with them.
- 7. Revising is the process of rewriting or reworking a piece of writing for clarity, style, unity, and organization.

 The sentence "However, if a fire occurs, an hour or more away, in the middle of the day, many members are at their jobs" should be revised because it does not express a complete thought and contains comma splices, which make it hard to understand. One way to revise the sentence would be the following: However, if a fire located an hour or more away from the station gets phoned in during the afternoon, most volunteer firefighters are at their jobs and unable to respond.
- 8. In this paragraph, sentence 4 introduces a new idea. The beginning of the paragraph is about the color associated with St. Patrick's Day. This sentence is more about the holiday itself. It can be used to start a new paragraph. Sentence 5 continues the thought from sentence 4 and would be confusing if it started a new paragraph.
- 9. The correct answer for the first drop-down menu is "malfunctioned noisily" because it most clearly conveys the author's point that the sewing machine broke suddenly and made a loud "screeching" noise. The correct answer for the second drop-down menu is "exclaimed" because this word most accurately describes the character's mood. Lizaveta is upset that the machine has broken and worried about being fired. The most precise phrase in the third drop-down menu is "quickly completed her project." This phrasing best reinforces the fact that Lizaveta works fast to meet her deadline and impress her boss.
- 10. The correct answer for the first drop-down menu is "thrive" because this word most clearly conveys the author's point that the cool, moist climate has caused the redwood trees to flourish for thousands of years. The most precise phrase in the second drop-down menu is "resistant to damage and disease." The other answer choices contain unnecessary repetition or ambiguous wording. The correct answer in the third drop-down menu is "still exist today" because this wording best helps the reader understand the effect of the lumber industry on the redwoods.
